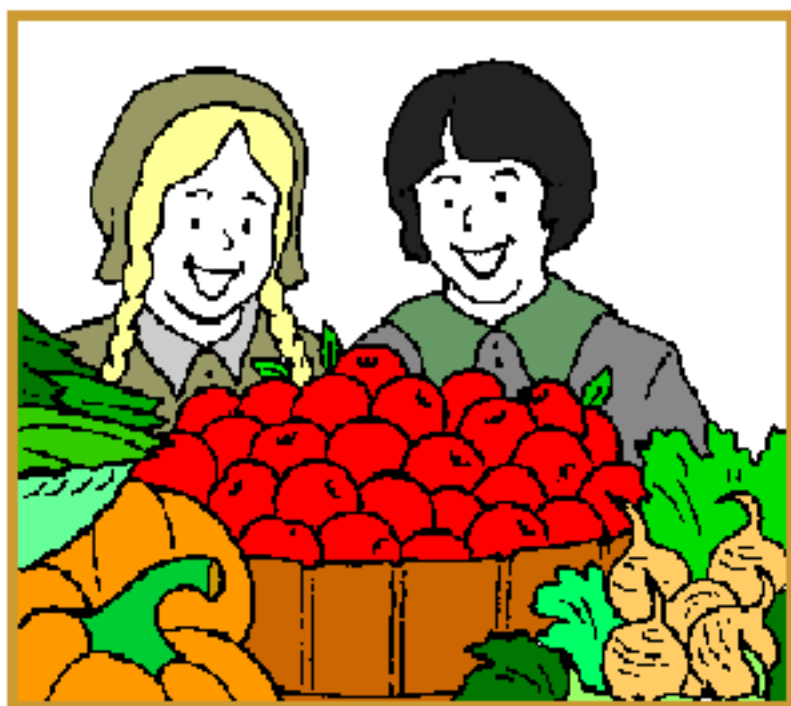

Thanksgiving



Pilgrims were people who came to America many years ago. They came across the ocean on a ship called the Mayflower.

The Pilgrims came from England. They wanted a place where they could have freedom from certain laws.

It was a very long and hard trip. Their small ship took ten weeks to cross the Atlantic Ocean.

One hundred and two, women, men, and children were crowded onto the small ship. They set sail in September of 1620.

They were headed for Virginia, but during a big storm at sea their ship was driven northward off its course.



Thanksgiving

The Mayflower landed on Cape Cod in what is now Massachusetts. They named the place where they landed Plymouth. It was named after the city they had sailed from in England.

A big stone on which they stepped ashore from their boat is now a special monument called Plymouth Rock.

The women and children stayed on the ship while the men put up a large building.

The large building served as a church, community meeting center, and as a hospital.

Next, the Pilgrims built a hut for each family. Food was scarce. The Pilgrims were happy for the clams and fish from the sea.

They built their colony and called it Plymouth. John Carver was elected the first governor of the colony.

The Pilgrims had very little food. Many of them became very sick. More than half of them died from the cold and sickness.

Only half of the little Pilgrim group had survived the bitter winter. Their governor died and William Bradford became their new governor.

In the spring the Mayflower was returning to England. Even though the Pilgrims had a horrible winter no one wanted to go back to England.

When spring came the Pilgrims cleared away the trees to plant corn and other vegetables. Some Indians saw them working and came to help them.
